b) Ketchum Recreation and Public Purposes Project Update - Jennifer L. Smith, Director of Parks & Recreation.

Jen Smith will update the City Council concerning the Recreation and Public Purposes Project. A detailed staff report has been provided in the meeting packet for Council review.

PANCREATIC CANCER AWARENESS MONTH PROCLAMATION

Declaring the month of November "Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month" in the City of Ketchum.

WHEREAS in 2013, an estimated 45,220 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the United States and 38,460 will die from the disease;

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers, is the fourth leading cause of cancer death in the United States, and is the only major cancer with a five-year relative survival rate in the single digits at just six percent;

WHEREAS when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is late stage, and 73 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year of their diagnosis while 94 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first five years;

WHEREAS approximately 200 deaths will occur in Idaho in 2013;

WHEREAS the incidence and death rate for pancreatic cancer are increasing and pancreatic cancer is anticipated to move from the fourth to the second leading cause of cancer death in the U.S. by 2020;

WHEREAS the U.S. Congress passed the *Recalcitrant Cancer Research Act* last year, which calls on the National Cancer Institute to develop a scientific frameworks, or strategic plans, for pancreatic cancer and other deadly cancers, which will help provide the strategic direction and guidance needed to make true progress against these diseases; and

WHEREAS the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network is the national organization serving the pancreatic cancer community in Ketchum and nationwide through a comprehensive approach that includes public policy, research funding, patient services, and public awareness and education related to developing effective treatments and a cure for pancreatic cancer;

WHEREAS the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network and its affiliates in Ketchum support those patients currently battling pancreatic cancer, as well as to those who have lost their lives to the disease, and are committed to nothing less than a cure;

WHEREAS the good health and well-being of the residents of Ketchum are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about pancreatic cancer and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments; therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Ketchum City Council designate the month of November 2013 as "Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month" in the City of Ketchum, on November 4, 2013.

**Ketchum Recreation & Public Purposes Update:
Final Design: CLOMR/LOMR Consideration, Estimated Date for 60% Design
Unveiling (Public Meeting)
Critical Path Update and Permitting Consideration**

Mayor Hall and City Councilors:

Introduction/History

The City of Ketchum applied for a Recreation and Public Purposes (R&PP) patent in 2008 for an approximate total of 316 acres of land owned by the United States and administered by the Bureau of Land Management. Part of the yet to be adopted management plan for the patent includes creation of a River Park along the Big Wood River about two miles north of City limits adjacent to the Hulen Meadows subdivision.

The City's partner in the R&PP patent application is the Wood River Land Trust. Additionally, myriad stakeholders are engaged in multiple components of the patent including, but not limited to habitat restoration, flood mitigation, recreation and accessibility.

The City undertook a formal master planning effort for an "area of intense study" within what is commonly known as the North Parcel in July 2011. S2o Design and Engineering, a Lyons, Colorado firm specializing in whitewater park and river recreation planning, was hired in January 2012 to provide professional design and engineering to create a master plan for a river park known as the River Park at Sun Peak. The River Park at Sun Peak is a focused area of recreational use while the remainder of the R&PP properties' uses will remain largely as they are today.

Between application for an R&PP patent in 2008 and present, City staff and BLM staff continue to work on the R&PP process. Important benchmarks have occurred thus far:

Parks & Recreation Department

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- The City of Ketchum applied for a “patent” in 2008 for two parcels of land described above. A potential well site at Sun Peak Picnic Site was included in the original application.
- Amendments to the original Ketchum R&PP occurred in 2009 including recreation enhancements adjacent to the Hulen Pond area. A white water park, a wheelchair accessible fishing pier, and a dog agility course were included. The dog agility course has since been removed.
- A “scoping open house” was performed by BLM in 2009.
- At the request of BLM, the City undertook a “master planning” effort for a
- The Ketchum R&PP and a land exchange between Wood River Land Trust and Blue Canyon Corporation were bifurcated in 2011 under the direction of the BLM State Director.
- The City was informed that the “discretionary” Ketchum R&PP would be discontinued due to other litigation mandates in the state of Idaho and federal budget cuts in late 2012; however, due to a concerted effort by the City, its partners and stakeholders, federal congressional representatives, and the BLM, the process was continued
- In January 2012, BLM State Director Steve Ellis suggested creating a “steering committee” comprised of BLM staff, City staff, and City contractors (legal and EA) for the purpose of discovering what needed to be done to continue the R&PP process under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process considering BLM constraints.
- The steering committee met for the fifth and final time on July 15, 2013 and accomplished several key items including:
 - Continuation of the Environmental Assessment process (previously, this contract was frozen at Mayor Hall’s direction)
 - Finalization of a Memorandum of Understanding between the BLM and the City outlining roles and responsibilities, conditions, and procedures to be followed during the preparation of the environmental documentation process;
 - Securing a NEPA Review Contractor under an Administrative Support Agreement to perform the work of a BLM Interdisciplinary Team at the City’s cost (again, due to federal budget constraints);
 - Execution of a Final Design process led by S2o Design and Engineering.
 - Set schedule for follow-up conference calls between BLM and designated City points-of-contact.
- The City of Ketchum contracted with S2o Design and Engineering for Environmental Assessment work in 2012. The EA contract is considered Contract Amendment #2 with S2o. Subcontractor GeoEngineers was performing most of the EA work. The contract was frozen in late 2012, however, when BLM indicated to the City that forward progress on the Ketchum R&PP was to be stalled indefinitely. Following a great deal of work by the BLM State Director’s Steering Committee, EA work resumed in early 2013.

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- The City of Ketchum contracted for Final Design and Construction Documentation Services with S2o in late June 2013. The Final Design contract is considered Contract Amendment #3 with S2o. Final Design entails (1.) Preliminary design of the River Park at Sun Peak, (2.) Preliminary Design Report, (3.) Client Meeting (presentation of the preliminary design (60% Design) for review and approval in anticipation of submission for permitting), (4.) Permitting, (5.) Final Design and, (6.) Construction Documentation.
- The City of Ketchum committed funds to hire a NEPA Review Contractor (hired and supervised by BLM) to provide review services for the Environmental Assessment document. The NEPA Review Contractor replaces a BLM in-house Interdisciplinary Team (IDT) of scientists who typically review EA work. BLM indicated to the City that it did not have resources to provide an IDT but that a NEPA Review contracting firm is the next best standard alternative. The BLM selected AECOM through a competitive bidding process as its Review Contractor.
- *Environmental Assessment and NEPA Review Contractor update:* The target date for completion of the Environmental Assessment document was August 6, 2013; however, the EA was officially completed on August 19. Chapters of the EA were reviewed by City staff and legal director, Cherese McLain. EA chapters were also being given a cursory review by NEPA Review contractor, AECOM, prior to the EA's full completion. The NEPA Review Contractor completed its review of the EA document on Friday, August 30. The EA document has also been reviewed by several BLM staffers and a representative from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Discrepancies were identified by reviewing parties using "track changes" in the Word document. These discrepancies will be addressed by the EA contractor (GeoEngineers) and NEPA Specialist for the Idaho State BLM Office, Eric Mayes. GeoEngineers requested more time to work through the comments and submit a further edited document. Once the draft EA is approved by BLM, it will be released for a 30 (thirty) day public comment period. Comments will be assimilated and vetted prior to BLM making its final determination of whether to approve the EA.
- *Final Design process:* Following a kick-off meeting between the Final Design contractor (S2o Design and Engineering) and the City (represented by this writer) that occurred on July 2, 2013, five conference calls have occurred with the design team and client (again, represented by this writer). Conference calls are held at one or two-week intervals to ensure communication between design team members and adherence to the contractor's identified critical path. Design details are being vetted and incorporated through feasibility analysis and public feedback.

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The last Ketchum R&PP update to City Council was presented on October 7, 2013.

Current Report

General Updates

Final Design: An anticipated public unveiling of the 60% preliminary design date will tentatively be released at the City Council meeting (the date was unavailable at the time of this writing). The unveiling will take place in a public setting and will involve the entire design team. The public will have the opportunity to comment on detailed elements of the plan. Members of the public are also encouraged to stay engaged with the director of parks & recreation regarding final design process. Comments received through this office are forwarded to Eric Mayes, NEPA Specialist for the Idaho BLM State Office for inclusion in the Ketchum R&PP files.

Final Design (completion of design of all park elements) that further incorporates public input regarding preliminary design will be revealed some time in fiscal year 2013-14.

A change order from S2o Design and Engineering is forthcoming regarding the “no rise” certificate. Engineers with S2o are recommending that a Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMR) or Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) be submitted to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in lieu of a No Rise certificate. A change order is required because of the significant cost of preparing and submitting a CLOMR. The CLOMR is recommended because it will create a more accurate description of existing conditions relative to the floodplain. In S2o’s opinion, the current effective model is not reflective of existing conditions. A discussion between S2o engineer Dan Woolley, County engineer Jeff Loomis and Blaine County zoning specialist Nancy Cooley revealed concurrence. This issue is a work in progress; inclusion with this report is for disclosure purposes.

Invoices are currently being submitted by S2o Design and Engineering for both Environmental Assessment and Final Design. Invoices are accompanied by an “accounting memo” written by this author in an effort to clearly communicate expenditures compared to contracts as well as document revenue for the project coming in the form of donations.

Public Outreach and Education: Elements of an outreach plan are ongoing. These elements include an updated River Park at Sun Peak/Ketchum R&PP web page on the City’s website, a one-page flyer, and a display to be installed at the Ketchum Town Square. This display was installed just prior to the outbreak of the Beaver Creek Fire. Additionally, members of the Mayor’s Task Force have agreed to provide information and solicit feedback from individuals and community groups. BLM will provide written notice of opportunities for public

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comment on the NEPA and R&PPA processes currently underway; the City will also provide notification through avenues such as the City website, City e-newsletter, and press releases.

Maintenance and Management Plan: Of significance to several stakeholders is a stated “maintenance and management plan” which would ensure the long-term viability of the River Park at Sun Peak. Maintenance and management of the entire two-parcel R&PP application property are included in two approved documents submitted to BLM: the *Updated Plan of Development November 2012* and *Master Plan Document: Ketchum River Park at Sun Peak October 2012*. Maintenance and management plans for the two parcels including the River Park at Sun Peak and including estimated annual, periodic, and long-term costs are included in these documents. Specific recommended annual budget amounts are currently being developed based upon scope of the final design and outcome of the NEPA process. A final adaptive maintenance and management plan is anticipated that will take into consideration the dynamic nature of the natural resources and environmental variables of the project. Completed final design and environmental assessment will dictate this adaptive maintenance and management plan.

Critical Path and Permitting Considerations: A critical path graphic will be shared that outlines timeline tasks related to the Recreation and Public Purposes Act, the National Environmental Policy Act, and other local, state and federal permitting considerations. Because federal, state and local permits cannot be submitted by the City of Ketchum without clear legal interest in the property, it was determined that a “critical path graphic” would be helpful in understanding which process steps must occur before others may be considered.

Financial Requirement/Impact

Financial requirement for a CLOMR/LOMR will be submitted in the form of a change order from S2o Design and Engineering. A meeting of the R&PP Task Force on October 31 will reveal donor potential for the CLOMR/LOMR.

Another financial impact consideration for City Council is the fact that BLM could not afford to pay the City of Ketchum for its annual property maintenance agreement that has been in place since 2006. The City and BLM signed an Assistance Agreement in 2006 which stated that the Parks Division would be paid an annual fee of approximately \$2,500 for seasonal maintenance of the two R&PP parcels. BLM did not pay for this service during fiscal year 2012-13; however, the Parks Division continued the maintenance work through the remainder of the season. BLM recently informed the City that it could not pay for seasonal maintenance of the parcels in fiscal year 2013-14 either.

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Recommendation

It is recommended that City Council provide direction to the director of parks and recreation regarding seasonal maintenance of the two R&PP parcels.

StreetArt Project

Mayor Hall and City Councilors:

Introduction/History

City Administrator Gary Marks introduced a project to commemorate the City of Ketchum's 50th anniversary of incorporation as an Idaho municipality on October 16, 2010. Mr. Marks assembled the Ketchum 50th Anniversary Celebration Committee and, along with the Ketchum Community Development Corporation, commissioned a 50th Anniversary Commemorative Coin Program. Coin designs were developed by individual artists and designs were selected by a blind jury process.

Artists who submitted designs for the contest and were selected by a jury included Denise DeCoster, Ralph Harris, Adam Marks, Noah Bowen, and Gary Marks. The jury evaluated each submission without knowledge of the identity of the artists involved. Mr. Marks removed himself from judging the designs because of his capacity as a submitting artist for the coin project. Mr. Marks based the program on a similar endeavor he led in Whitefish, Montana whereby the commemorative coins were sold to community members as a fundraiser. Sponsors for the Ketchum project did not materialize, however, and the coin project ended with the seven designs (one common reverse [tails] design and six different heads designs) printed, framed and hung in the Council Chamber.

In 2013, Jack Mackie, a renowned public art consultant from Seattle, Washington, visited Ketchum at the invitation of the Ketchum Arts Commission to lead a community discussion regarding public art ideas for Ketchum. During a slide lecture for Ketchum City staff, newly hired Public Works Director/City Engineer, Robyn Mattison noticed the coin designs on the wall in the Council Chamber and brought up the notion of utilizing the coin designs for manhole covers in Ketchum. City Administrator Gary Marks then pitched the idea to Mayor Randy Hall and the Ketchum Arts Commission and the idea was received positively by all.

The original art work for the coin project is owned by the City. The project artists were all contacted and have expressed enthusiasm for the manhole project. The coin project, adjusted in its new iteration, was christened "StreetArt" by a loose knit committee consisting of City staff and the Ketchum Arts Commission. The KAC made the decision to start with the train and skier patterns for gaining a three-dimensional proof from the foundry.

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Current Report

Robyn Mattison researched cost for the manhole cover project and brought cost estimates from Neenah Foundry to Mr. Marks and Mayor Hall. Mayor Hall directed staff to proceed with the project based on estimated cost per design of \$5,907 for 20 manhole covers. Robyn will present a slide show of the project and manhole cover locations for the downtown core.

Financial Requirement/Impact

Financial requirement for the project is expected not to exceed \$5,907 per design and is covered under the General Fund contingency. Each of the six designs will be produced and installed over the course of several months.

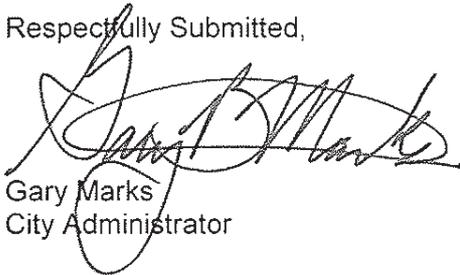

Attachment 1: NBS Welcome to Ketchum Schedule

Introduction/History

National Brotherhood of Skiers (NBS) is a nonprofit organization with a mission of introducing minorities to winter sports and to support and develop athletes of color. The National Brotherhood of skiers has grown to 77 clubs representing 43 cities and a membership of 8,000. NBS is recognized by the ski industry as one of the largest ski organizations and it's Summit as the largest gathering of skiers and riders, more than any other ski convention in the United States.

NBS is planning for an attendance of 1500 registered attendees for this year's event in Sun Valley and Ketchum. An additional 500 people "non-registered" (attendees that come to the event but are not dues paying members) are also expected for a total of 2000 attendees. With an average 5 night stay, estimating \$150 spent per person a day, in the City of Ketchum this event is poised to bring in well over \$1.5 million dollars to the City of Ketchum alone.

NBS was last in Sun Valley February 25 through March 03, 2012. The event was a big success for local businesses and for the NBS organization. They will be back here in Sun Valley February 22- March 1, 2014.

In 2012, the City hired Sun Valley Events to liaison with NBS and Sun Valley Resort for events in Ketchum. In 2012, Sun Valley Events managed a kickoff event in town square, a pub crawl, a Dine Around and a Poker Run which involved increasing foot traffic for Ketchum merchants. They also solicited raffle items from local merchants on behalf of NBS. This year Sun Valley Events is helping to organize all of the activities shown on the attached agenda, as well as organizing Welcome Bags and VIP bags for NBS Organizers and Board Members.

At the conclusion of the 2012 NBS visit, the NBS organizers expressed their appreciation of Ketchum's efforts and stated that, as a result of the welcome that they received here, that they would look to return in the near future. They had already contracted with another resort for 2013, but scheduled Sun Valley for 2014.

Current Report

The Events Commission has discussed this event. Their mission is to fund events that support and conduct entertainment and events which celebrate the spirit, character, history and heroes of Ketchum. The NBS event, while it is an economic driver, is not an event open to the general public. The Events Commission did not feel this event was a viable candidate for the funding under their mission statement. However, staff believes the event is important, and has great economic benefits. Staff is recommending a contract for services with Sun Valley Events again this year that could be funded out of Contingency, instead of the \$30,000 set aside for events that meet the mission of the Events Commission.

Sun Valley Events have developed some conservative estimates of the economic benefits in Ketchum. Most attendees stay for 5 days. If 1,000 of the attendees each spent \$150 per day in Ketchum, the economic value would be \$1.5 million. The true number is likely higher.

Financial Requirement/Impact

Two years ago, the contract amount was \$5,000. Sun Valley Events has stated that, based on their experience in 2012, the contract amount this year should be \$5,500. This item is not budgeted, and if approved, would be drawn from Contingency.

Recommendation

I recommend that the Council approve a contract for services with Sun Valley Events to coordinate Ketchum portions of the National Brotherhood of Skiers 2014 event in an amount not to exceed \$5,500.

1. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Randy Hall at 5:30pm.

2. Communications from Mayor and Councilors

Councilor Nina Jonas noted that Clif Bar is opening a facility in Twin Falls, with 200-300 jobs. Council President Baird Gourlay said that the Twin Falls URA also brought in Chobani and a number of other businesses to Twin Falls.

Councilor Michael David said the new convenience store at Warm Springs and 10th Street is open, although it is heavily camouflaged. Mayor Randy Hall said the new convenience store is really improved and well done.

3. Presentation of Certificates of Recognition

Mayor Randy Hall presented a Certificate of Recognition to Ketchum Recreation Supervisor John Kearney. Parks and Recreation Department staff and participants surprised Kearney with a huge shout and show of thanks. Kearney said he is fortunate to watch kids grow up and enjoy the recreation facilities Ketchum provides.

4. Communications from the Public

There was no public comment at this time.

5. Bald Mountain Lodge Project Update

Disclosures: Mayor Randy Hall and Council President Baird Gourlay met earlier today with the Bald Mountain team to get an update on the project.

Bald Mountain Hotel received an extension on their entitlements in April. Shortly afterward, Bald Mountain Hotel CEO Mike Kerby notified Ketchum that they were exploring options to develop the property on their own, find a development partner, or market the property for sale. They listed the property for sale with CBRE, a commercial real estate firm which exclusively handles hotel properties out of their Seattle office. At this time, there are 21 potential interested parties, but few are interested in buying the property outright. Bald Mountain Hotel still hopes to find a development partner. The debt on the property will be paid off on December 1.

Bald Mountain LLC General Partner Steve Burnstead introduced a potential partner, Joe Champ of Champ Hospitality, who is familiar with the area and visiting. The hotel industry is just now starting to pick up again; and loans are still very tough to get.

Burnstead thanked Ketchum for working to promote shoulder seasons with events and active sports other than skiing. Reliable air service and ground service from Boise is very important in marketing a hotel. He encouraged Ketchum to continue its efforts on behalf of all the hotel projects.

6. FY2013-14 Wastewater SCADA System Contract for Services

Ketchum Public Works Director Robyn Mattison recommended approval of the SCADA System contract, which provides 24/7 phone and remote system support for the wastewater treatment plant.

Councilor Michael David moved to approve Services Contract with Banyan Technology, Inc. in the amount of \$8,803. Motion seconded by Councilor Jim Slanetz, and passed unanimously.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM CITY STAFF

7. Discussion on Right-of-Way Encroachment Permit processes

Ketchum Planning Manager Joyce Allgaier submitted a report on right-of-way encroachment permits. The report outlines the types of permits, right-of-way (temporary) construction permits and licenses for permanent right-of-way encroachments, and temporary uses in the right-of-way.

Ketchum Street Superintendent Brian Christiansen said the process would correct current holes in the Code like a crane in the street to place mechanical equipment on the roof or using the street for a concrete truck to pour concrete.

Ketchum Public Works Director Robyn Mattison said a key goal of updating the process was to streamline communication between departments.

Councilor Jonas asked that the permits be reasonably priced; and urged staff to be sure landscaping encroachments didn't obstruct line of sight and cause parking concerns for drivers. She asked about FOR SALE signs on the sidewalk.

City Attorney Stephanie Bonney said all permits specify that the City can request the encroachment be removed.

The Clerk's office is concerned about a liability insurance provision that states the City is a co-insurer for any items that encroach into the right-of-way. This provision requires Ketchum to know who the co-insurer/owner of the property is. Ketchum is already covered by its own insurance, and Idaho has a fairly strong tort claim act. Additional coverage would be good if someone is hurt in the right-of-way, but the additional coverage may not be worth the added administrative burden. Ketchum Council felt the added insurance was redundant.

8. Discussion on possible changes to Chapter 40 of the Ketchum Municipal Code, the Percent for Public Art Chapter

Ketchum City Administrator Gary Marks said Chapter 40 currently requires his review of projects and the amount to go to Percent for Public Art at the end of the budget year. The Code currently says that every capital project is included ... with some exceptions, some of which require the City Administrator to make a judgment call. Marks suggested Council appropriate a percentage of the immediate past year's audit of capital projects, except for water and sewer enterprise funds, for Public Art; and further suggested Council increase the percentage from the current 1.33%. Mayor Hall said the Council could just decide to allocate a certain amount every year during the budget process. City Administrator Marks said the Council could do both a percentage and an additional allocation. Staff will offer some suggestions at an upcoming meeting.

9. Recommendation to cancel the Monday, December 16, 2013 Regular City Council meeting

City Administrator Marks suggested the second December meeting is historically short and poorly attended. Council could hold a special short meeting to pay bills.

Council President Baird Gourlay moved to cancel the Monday, December 16, 2013 Regular City Council meeting. Motion seconded by Councilor Michael David, and passed unanimously.

10. Communications from the Press

No questions at this time.

11. FY2013-14 Sun Valley Marketing Board Contract for Services

Sun Valley Marketing Alliance Chief Marketing Officer Arlene Schieven presented FY2013 sales indicators, local option tax and accommodations results, and Sun Valley target market air passengers counts. Results were much better prior to August and the Beaver Creek fire.

- Sun Valley and Ketchum combined LOT October 2012 through July 2013 increased 3%.
- Accommodations through the website were up almost 40%. Winter occupancy was strong. Summer was a decline due to the August Beaver Creek Fire.
- Strong increase on winter air service from both Seattle and Los Angeles. Even with the fire, results are up 5%.
- Website visits increased 20% over the year. Searching for Sun Valley blog saw almost 50,000 people. 31% increase in Facebook followers. All exceeded goals set at the beginning of the year.
- Winter ski campaign started October 15, and will target Seattle, L.A. and San Francisco. SVMA dropped Boise target due to budget cuts, but Sun Valley Resort maintains a strong presence in Boise.
- A Nordic campaign starts in November.
- Ride Sun Valley is transitioning to an external producer.
- SVMA is working on a Visitor Volume Model that will distinguish between visitors and visitor days.
- SVMA is conducting stakeholder outreaches with members and other interested parties.
- Sun Valley named #4 of Top Ten Ski Resorts in the West.
- Shoulder events Crosstoberfest, the Jazz Festival, and the Wood River Studio Tour got great PR.

- Local and state contributions for FY2014 are consistent with previous years, except the City of Sun Valley's contribution was cut to about half.
 - SVMA is working closely with Fly Sun Valley Alliance to target air service markets.
- Marty Albertson said *Men's Health* magazine had great articles on Sun Valley.

12. FY2013-14 Snow Hauling Contracts for Services

Ketchum Street Superintendent Brian Christiansen recommended Council approve the snow hauling contracts for services for FY2013-14.

Councilor Michael David moved to approve the contracts for service with Joe's Backhoe Service, Inc.; Scott Erwin Excavation, Inc.; Sawtooth Construction DBA Earthworks LLC; Hiatt Trucking, Inc.; Katco Excavation, Inc.; Rick's Excavation, Inc.; Anderson Asphalt Paving; All Seasons Landscaping; Bald Mountain Excavation and Lunceford Excavation, Inc. Motion seconded by Councilor Nina Jonas, and passed unanimously.

13. Hotel Ketchum Third Amendment to the Development Agreement

Also Present: Hotel Ketchum Attorney Ed Lawson

Council requested this item be continued to tonight's meeting in order to answer some questions raised by the public. Developer Jack Bariteau answered the questions in an email, and a public comment email was also received. Councilors said they understood the situation better after reading Bariteau's explanation.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

- Phyllis Shafran asked if the entitlements go with the land if the property is in default and goes to auction. She said Bariteau had made a point that the property would be developed by someone who lives here. Shafran said she'd heard that Bariteau's counsel advised CED Director Lisa Horowitz to not inform Council of the default. City Attorney Stephanie Bonney said entitlements run with the land, within the timeframe. The City can never give preference to someone depending on who they are or where they live. CED Director Lisa Horowitz said the City is notified of all defaults throughout the city and they are public record.
- Anne Corrock concurred that Bariteau had made a strong point that he was a local part of the community and deserved consideration for the extension on that basis.
- Brennan Rego would have liked to see Bariteau's letter as part of Council's packet. He added that he'd like to see anyone build a hotel in Ketchum, and was glad the entitlements ran with the land.

Council President Baird Gourlay moved to approve the third amendment to the Hotel Ketchum Development Agreement. Motion seconded by Councilor Nina Jonas, and passed unanimously.

14. Community Housing Credit Agreement with Blaine County Housing Authority and River Run Condominiums, LLC

CED Director Lisa Horowitz noted that Council did not approve \$6,000 in-kind grant for the Visitors Center in the FY2014 budget.
