# **Ketchum Named Tree City USA by Arbor Day Foundation**

Tenth Year in a Row

KETCHUM, Idaho — Ketchum has been named a 2013 Tree City USA by the Arbor Day Foundation for its commitment to effective urban management.

This is the tenth year in a row that Ketchum has received the honor. Requirements include having a tree board or department, a tree-care ordinance, an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita and an Arbor Day observance and proclamation.

The Tree City USA program is sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation in partnership with the U.S. Forest Service and the National Association of State Foresters.

"Ketchum's trees give us cleaner air, improved storm water management and increased property values," said Juerg Stauffacher, parks and natural resources superintendent. "We appreciate the recognition from the Arbor Day Foundation."
