City Seeks Fellowship Applicants

New Program Will Address Four Issues

KETCHUM, Idaho — The city is seeking applicants for its new fellowship program, designed to help the city address four specific issues.

Fellows are asked to submit proposals to address one of the following:

- Solution for the Effects of the Short-Term Rental Market on Affordable Housing
- Achieving Net Zero Energy Use by City Departments
- Interactive Website Enhancements to Simplify Public Access to Useful Information
- Furthering the City's Strategy on a Real Estate Transfer Fee to Fund Community Housing

"The goal is to get valuable assistance on city initiatives, inject the city with fresh perspectives and introduce Ketchum to a new audience," said Mayor Nina Jonas.

The City Council appropriated \$10,000 for stipends for the program.
