4. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE PUBLIC on matters not on the agenda

Mayor Neil Bradshaw asked for comments from the public

Baird Gourley talked about the alley between East and Leadville and advised that the common dumpster that has been added to the alley is an asset. He is requesting the city move the planter boxes back 3 feet. He talked about the code in the Commercial Code and is asking this be put on a future agenda for consideration.

- 6. PUBLIC HEARINGS AND DISCUSSIONS (Public comment and input taken on the following items)
 - a. ACTION: Third Reading of Ordinance #1188, Annual Appropriations Ordinance

Mayor Neil Bradshaw explained that there is new information from the Sheriff and he needs time to digest this information. He would like to table the third reading of Ordinance 1188 to review those numbers and bring them in alignment.

Mayor Neil Bradshaw opened the meeting up for public comment.

Natty Stoic - speaking on behalf of KIC advised the council that she has created 2 businesses in the KIC and is very appreciative of the business park.

Emmi Buck utilized the KIC in 2014 and moved away but is now back because of the KIC. She is very pleased with her presence there and is very excited about the community and the involvement.

Elizabeth Hendrix talked about her support of KIC and is appreciative of the council's financial support.

Christy Ann Gerber, Interim Director of KIC talked about all that KIC has to offer. She touched on their partnering with other organizations.

Preston Clark has been working with Christy Ann Gerber in the KIC. He talked about his involvement and the support he has had since coming to the KIC.

Mayor Neil Bradshaw asked council for comments. Councilor Amanda Breen advised that she met with the members at KIC last week. She is very encouraged by what she has learned and is pleased with their response in coming forward with more measurables.

Elizabeth Hendrix advised that she still donates her time.

Councilor Courtney Hamilton questioned the Sheriff's number. Mayor Neil Bradshaw explained that the County has not yet approved however, there is a difference of \$118,000 more than what we have in the current draft budget. Mayor Bradshaw will bring this back to the September 4, 2018 meeting. Individual contracts for services will be decided on in September and/or October.

b. ACTION: Update to City Fee Resolution #18-020 to reflect changes to certain fees including water and wastewater rates

Mayor Neil Bradshaw opened the meeting for public comment. There was none.

Director of Finance & Internal Services Grant Gager talked about adjusting water and waste water rates and explained the reason for the price increase. Waste Water will increase by 30 % and Water by 15%. Grant Gager explained that we are also seeking the authority to pass recording fees onto the customer when recording certain documents at the County. Councilor Courtney Hamilton questioned who the County fee would affect. Grant Gager explained the County's fees and how that works and advised that we would be passing the recording fees onto the applicant.

The increases in utility fees will assist in the Ketchum Springs project as well as capital improvements on water and waste water side. As soon as Ketchum Springs is done all water will be metered in the City. City Administrator Suzanne Frick advised we are looking at Impact Fees and both ends will be looked at. Councilor Jim Slanetz questioned the Fire Hydrant charge fee.

Director of Planning & Building John Gaeddert advised he would like to make a change in the definition of retail trade by adding "grocery store" by way of example.

Mayor Neil Bradshaw opened the meeting for public comment - There was none.

Motion to approve the 2nd reading of Ordinance 1189 finding the text amendments are in accordance with the 2014 Comprehensive Plan and to read by title only with the amended update as stated by John Gaeddert.

d. ACTION: Recommendation to authorize use of Housing In-Lieu Funds to off-set building and impact fees associated with construction of community housing units in Ketch development—Mayor Neil Bradshaw

Mayor Neil Bradshaw talked about the possibility of using in lieu housing fees for community housing.

Mayor Neil Bradshaw opened the meeting for public comment. There was no comment,

Councilor Amanda Breen asked if we used impact fees for in lieu housing funds in the past. City Administrator Suzanne Frick explained that she does not believe so. Amanda Breen talked about the existing ordinance. Suzanne Frick explained the funding aspect and advised that the funds would be going into the infrastructure where that project is affecting. The procedure of dispersing those funds was discussed. Suzanne Frick explained that we would take the funds off the invoice and we would redesignate the location of the fees in the budget.

Councilor Jim Slanetz is not clear on this request. He likes the incentive but does not feel the council was in the discussion phase of this topic. He has concerns about the policy and questions if the in-lieu funds couldn't be spent in a better way. The council deliberated the income levels. Mayor Bradshaw has concerns about striving for perfection and then not getting anything done. It was clarified that this is just for this project. Each project would come as a case by case basis. Jim Slanetz has concerns about the deed restriction.

Motion to authorize staff to use in-lieu funds to pay the impact fees for the three Ketch community housing units.

7. STAFF AND COUNCIL COMMUNICATIONS (council deliberation, public comment not taken)

a. Discussion of Mountain Rides Summer Circulator—Neil Bradshaw

Mayor Neil Bradshaw talked about this being a new route. Director of Finance and Internal Services Grant Gager talked about there not being a pattern in the numbers. Councilor Amanda Breen agrees that a new bus route is not instantly a success. They deliberated about times. Grant Gager reiterated that getting a new route in service is difficult. West Ketchum Winter service was touched upon. Council President Michael David talked about his experience of driving the bus and citizen's questioning the cost. Weather plays a part in it as well. Mayor & Council deliberated the pros and cons of the route and the times of the year when it may be effective.

b. Discussion of City Noise Ordinance—Councilmember Jim Slanetz

Councilor Jim Slanetz advised that he has received complaints in certain areas after 10 pm regarding the Noise Ordinance. Currently at 10 pm the decibel level must go down. The police have decibel meters that they use at the property line. Police Chief Dave Kassner explained that these are summer time complaint's. Mayor Neil Bradshaw talked about setting decibel levels and times of years. This is strictly a policy question. Dave Kassner suggested taking measurements of bands in various locations. Councilor Courtney Hamilton would like to get more public comment on this. Council President Michael David said the time as well as the decibel needs to be discussed further. Currently any band after 7:30 pm is in violation. Councilor Amanda Breen suggested getting some decibel readings over the next few events over the next few weeks.
