1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Nina Jonas called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm.

3. COMMUNICATIONS FROM MAYOR AND COUNCILORS

There was a discussion regarding the Fire Marshall position. Suzanne Frick City Administrator explained the thought process behind the decision to extend the application process by one week. There was a discussion among council as to if they should be involved in the decision as to how this has been handled and who's responsibility it is to handle it.

Mayor Nina Jonas explained her thought process behind her decision as to how this was handled. Suzanne Frick, City Administrator explained the internal process.

Council President Michael David brought up home mail delivery in Ketchum. Mayor Nina Jonas asked for suggestions as to how to address this. Councilor Baird Gourlay explained the discussions that were had in the past. Suzanne Frick City Administrator said we could reach out to the post office and learn what the process is and bring it back to council for further discussion.

Councilor Anne Corrock brought up what she referred to as the "RV Issue". She would like to be able to work with staff to figure out how we can be friendlier with RV users and asked for the Mayor's permission to work with staff. Councilor Jim Slanetz and Councilor Anne Corrock will work together to work on RV's and camping areas.

Councilor Anne Corrock talked about council members attending a webinar and if it needs to be noticed. Susan Buxton Attorney said to just notice that council will be watching a webinar and that the public is invited with a 24 hour meeting notice.

4. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE PUBLIC

a. Communications from the public. For items not on the agenda.

Amanda Breen, Attorney and resident 291 2nd Street and a business owner at 371 Walnut Ave. N. She promoted mail delivery in Ketchum and talked about environment and quality of life. She said she agrees this is a community project and asked for City support and asked for one of the council to work with her to form a committee and move forward with this.

Rebecca Rush voiced concerns regarding the Fire Department job opening issue and how it was handled. She asked that the original posting be a promotion rather than a job opening.

Karen McCall, Ketchum Energy Advisory Committee - Talked about ribbon cutting for the Ore Wagon Solar Panel installation, December 17, 2015 and invited council to participate. Electric car charging areas were discussed.

Erica Lidstrom would like to announce a program that will help with energy efficiency and solar energy adoption.

5. COMMUNICATIONS FROM STAFF

a. Recommendation to amend ordinance language regarding camping on city property – Sharon Arms, Special Events Coordinator

Sharon Arms, City Event Coordinator presented requesting adding verbiage to allow camping in city parks when approved with a special event application. There was a discussion regarding camping and recreational vehicles. Sharon Arms explained that each application will be looked at individually.

Mayor Nina Jonas asked for public comment.

Rebecca Rush, citizen voiced her support of this approval.

Between the city of Ketchum and IEG Thunder Spring LLC Micah Austin, Director of Planning and
Building

Mayor Nina Jonas outlined the new procedure for the hearing process.

David Hutchinson, Applicant said they are comfortable with the agreement.

There were no questions from Council.

Micah Austin, Director of Planning & Building said that the agreement fulfills all obligations and explained that the document has changed slightly. Susan Buxton City Attorney talked about the changes in the agreement.

Micah Austin Director of Planning & Building said there were 3 written comments that were included in last meetings packet. Attorney Susan Buxton talked about the Lien and clarified exactly what the lien means to the city. The lien will come to us at the time of the building permit.

b. Public Hearing and consideration of Ordinance 1142 to amend Ordinance 1076 to revise the composition of the board positions of the Urban Renewal Agency Board of Commissioners as appointed by the Mayor and City Council—Micah Austin, Director of Planning and Building

Micah Austin explained the ordinance in the packet and the composition of the URA Board and the terms they would hold. How members get appointed was discussed. Discussion of a typo regarding elected officials and council members was brought up. The wording should be changed to Ketchum Mayor & City Council. Micah explained that 3 council members' terms will expire at the end of this year. Only two can be re-appointed:

c. Public Hearing and consideration of proposed text amendments by Brett Moellenberg to the Zoning Regulations, Section 17.12.020 District Use Matrix to add "Assembly, Place of" as a Conditional Use Permit in the LI-2 District; "Parking, Shared" as a permitted use in the LI-1, LI-2 & LI-3 Districts and to Section 17.125.070 (B) to add provisions for shared parking reductions.

Brett Mollenburg gave the history of The Spot and outlined all that they do with the students which is the primary use of their space. Brett Mollenburg explained that they were putting on shows in the space without knowing they were not allowed to have assembly use in the LI District until Mike Elle Fire Chief brought it to their attention.

Mayor Nina Jonas asked for council questions.

Councilor Baird Gourlay had concerns regarding parking. Brett Mollenburg explained that all events are at night and on the weekends when there is no business in the area. Councilor Annie Corrock questioned the amount of shows they have had and how many they anticipate having. Brett Mollenburg explained there are 4 shows a year for a total of 8 or 9 weeks. There was a discussion as to moving to another space and what is available and what would work for their shows. Scheduling conflicts and growth space were discussed. Council President Michael David brought up financial concerns.

Morgan Brim Senior Planner presented what happened on the Planning & Zoning level. Mayor Nina Jonas voiced concerns regarding public parking. Suzanne Frick City Administrator said this is important because assembly use would be allowed anywhere in this district with a conditional use permit.

Morgan Brim Senior Planner asked City Council to consider amending the proposal before them and outlined options council has when making changes or approving this application.

Mayor Nina Jonas asked for council questions.

Council Present Michael David questioned accessory use. Morgan Brim addressed.

Mayor Nina Jonas asked for public comment.

An artist with the spot brought up the point that they draw more business into the core because of their show.

Applicant Brett Mollenburg talked about the shared parking space and the fact that they have more parking than the Next Stage.

Mayor Nina Jonas closed Public Hearing.

Mayor Nina Jonas has concerns. Councilor Baird Gourlay suggested they do the accessory use, limit the hours, and restrict the numbers of days per month with hours being tied to the parking plan thatwas discussed. There was a discussion regarding if this theatre use is any different from allowing gallery walks. Council President Michael David has concerns about the Conditional Use Permit. Councilor Anne Corrock voiced her concerns and is unsure if she likes the overall idea. Suzanne Frick City Administrator said Assembly use is a concern. One option to consider is should we create a new use category that would allow artistic uses.

Brainstorming was done with staff, council and Mayor. Mayor Nina Jonas asked that Planning Department come back with some options and a planning analysis of these options.
