RESOLUTION NUMBER 745

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF KETCHUM, IDAHO, ESTABLISHING FEES AND CHARGES FOR THE KETCHUM FIRE DEPARTMENT'S PLAN CHECKS, PERMITS AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE 1997 UNIFORM FIRE CODE AND AMENDMENTS THERETO ADOPTED BY KETCHUM ORDINANCE 722.

WHEREAS, Ketchum Ordinance Number 722 adopting the 1997 Uniform Fire Code and amendments thereto provides that the fees and charges for plan checks, permits, and administration of said Ordinance shall be set by Resolution of the Ketchum City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL of the City of Ketchum, Idaho, as follows:

The following fees and charges are hereby established and shall be paid for the permits, plan checks, inspections and administration of the 1997 Uniform Fire Code and amendments thereto adopted by Ketchum Ordinance Number 722.

CITY OF KETCHUM PERMIT FEE SCHEDULE

FIRE DEPARTMENT

- A. Permits Required Under 1997 Uniform Fire Code Article 4
- a.1. Automatic fire alarm system. Inspections and acceptance testing of required fire alarm systems. Permit Fee \$25.00 per hour
- a.2. Automatic fire sprinkler system. Inspections and acceptance testing of required fire sprinkler systems. Permit Fee \$50.00 per riser plus \$.50 per head
- c.1. Carnivals and Fairs. To conduct a carnival or fair. Permit Fee \$50.00
- c.2. Compressed gases. To store, use or handle at normal temperatures and pressures compressed gases in excess of the amounts listed in Table 105-A. When the compressed gases in use or storage exceed the amounts listed in Table 105-A, a permit is required to install, repair, abandon, remove, place temporarily out of service, close or substantially modify a compressed gas system.

Exceptions:

- 1. Routine maintenance.
- For emergency repair work performed on emergency basis, application for permit shall be made within tow working days of commencement of work.

The permit applicant shall apply for approval to close storage, use or handling facilities at least 30 days prior to the termination of the storage, use or handling of compressed or liquefied gases. Such applicant shall include any change or alteration of the facility

closure plan filed pursuant to Section 8001.13. This 30-day period may be waived by the chief if there are special circumstances requiring such waiver. **Permit Fee \$50.00**

- c.3. Cryogens. Except where federal or state regulations apply and except for fuel systems of the vehicle, to produce, store or handle cryogens in excess of the amounts listed in Table 105-B. Permit Fee \$50.00
- d.1. **Dust-producing operations.** To operate a grain elevator, flour starch mill, feed mill, or plant pulverizing aluminum, coal, cocoa, magnesium, spices or sugar, or other operation producing combustible dusts as defined in Article 2. **Permit Fee \$50.00**
- e.1. Explosives or blasting agents. For permits for explosives or blasting agents, Permit Fee \$100.00
- f.1. Fire clearance certificates. Fire clearance certificates issued by the fire department for such uses as Nursery Schools, Day Care Centers and Foster Homes. Permit Fee \$20.00
- f.2. Fireworks. For permits for fireworks. Permit Fee \$25.00 + \$25.00 for inspection
- f.3. Flammable or combustible liquids.
 - 1. To use or operate, repair or modify a pipeline for the transportation of flammable or combustible liquids.
 - 2. To store, handle or use Class I liquids in excess of 5 gallons (18.9 L) in a building or in excess of 10 gallons (37.9 L) outside of a building, except that a permit is not required for the following:
 - 2.1 The storage or use of Class I liquids in the fuel tank of a motor vehicle, aircraft, motorboat, mobile power plant or mobile heating plant, unless such storage, in the opinion of the chief, would cause an unsafe condition.
 - 2.2 The storage or use of paints, oils, varnishes or similar flammable mixtures when such liquids are stored for maintenance, painting or similar purposes for a period of not more than 30 days.
 - 3. To store, handle or use Class II or Class III-A liquids in excess of 25 gallons (94.6 L) in a building or in excess of 60 gallons (227.1 L) outside of a building, except for fuel oil used in connection with oil burning equipment.
 - 4. To remove Class I or Class II liquids from an underground storage tank used for fueling motor vehicles by any means other than the approved, stationary on-site pumps normally used for dispensing operations.
 - 5. To install, alter, construct or operate tank vehicles, equipment, tanks, plant, terminals, wells fuel-dispensing stations, refineries, distilleries and similar facilities where flammable and combustible liquids are produced, processed, transported, stored, dispensed or used.
 - 6. To install, alter, remove, abandon, place temporarily out of service or otherwise dispose of a flammable or combustible liquid tank.
 - 7. To change the type of contents stored in a flammable or combustible liquid tank to a

material other than that for which the tank was designed and constructed. **Permit Fee \$100.00**

h.1. Hazardous Materials. To store, transport on site, dispense, use or handle hazardous materials in excess of the amounts listed in Table 105-C or to install, repair, abandon, remove, place temporarily out of service, close or substantially modify a storage facility or other area regulated by Article 80 when the hazardous materials in use or storage exceed the amounts listed in Table 105-C.

h.2. **Hood and duct.** Inspection and acceptance testing of hood and duct systems. **Permit Fee \$50.00**

- 1.1. Liquefied petroleum gases.
 - 1. To store, use, handle or dispense LP-gas.
 - 2. To install or maintain LP-gas containers.

Permit Fee \$25.00 up to 500 gallon water capacity, \$100.00 for 501 gallon capacity and above.

o.1. Open burning. To conduct open burning. Where burning is conducted on public property or the property of someone other than the permit applicant, the permit applicant shall demonstrate that permission has been obtained by the appropriate government agency, the owner, or the owner's authorized agent. When limits for atmospheric conditions or hours restrict burning, such limits shall be designated in the permit restrictions.

Permit Fee \$25.00

o.2. Oven, industrial baking or drying. To operate an industrial baking or drying oven regulated by Article 62.

Permit Fee \$50.00

- p.1. **Pyrotechnical special effects material.** For permits for pyrotechnical special effects material. **Permit Fee \$100.00**
- s.1. Spraying or dipping. To conduct a spraying or dipping operation utilizing flammable or combustible liquids or the application of combustible powders regulated by Article 45.

 Permit Fee \$50.00
- s.2. Standpipe systems. Inspection and acceptance testing of standpipe systems. Permit Fee \$50.00
- u.1. Use of apparatus. One hour minimum, use of fire department apparatus or personnel. Time is from station door to station door.

Personnel: \$20.00 per hour Apparatus: \$75.00 per hour

Plan check fees:

Fee for initial plan check for building construction.

Permit Fee 70% of building department plan check fee.

Fee for any additional plan check of revised plans or inspections.

Permit Fee in accordance with the Uniform Fire Code as adopted.

This schedule shall be available for inspection at the office of the Ketchum City Clerk and at the office of the Fire Chief.
