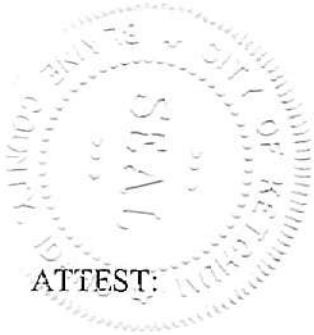
A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KETCHUM, IDAHO, DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO REJECT THE INITIATIVE PETITION SUBMITTED BY WALLY LIMBURG REGARDING THE POTENTIAL ANNEXATION OF WARM SPRINGS RANCH.

WHEREAS, the Wally Limburg submitted an initiative petition regarding the annexation of Warm Springs Ranch; and

WHEREAS, the Idaho Legislature left no room for direct legislation regarding the matter of annexation through the initiative process (*See Gumprecht v. City of Coeur D'Alene*, 104 Idaho 615 (1983); and I.C. §§ 67-6501 *et seq.* and 50-222); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Ketchum, Idaho, that the City Council hereby directs the City Clerk to reject the initiative petition submitted by Wally Limburg regarding the potential annexation of Warm Springs Ranch.

PASSED by the City Council, and APPROVED by the Mayor this 20th day of September, 2004.





MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

On 10/15/54, the Board of Directors of the City of Berkeley, California, met in regular session and discussed the proposed purchase of the property located at 1234 Main Street, Berkeley, California, owned by the Estate of John Doe.

The Board of Directors, after a thorough review of the proposed purchase and the financial statements of the Estate of John Doe, recommended that the City of Berkeley purchase the property for the sum of \$10,000.00.

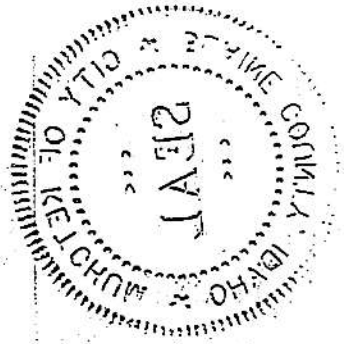
The Board of Directors further recommended that the City of Berkeley execute a purchase agreement with the Estate of John Doe, subject to the approval of the City Council.

The Board of Directors also recommended that the City of Berkeley pay the purchase price in three equal installments of \$3,333.33, to be paid on 12/31/54, 12/31/55, and 12/31/56.

The Board of Directors further recommended that the City of Berkeley execute a promissory note in favor of the Estate of John Doe, for the sum of \$10,000.00, payable in three equal installments of \$3,333.33, to be paid on 12/31/54, 12/31/55, and 12/31/56.

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
